In 2014, the domestic outbreak of Ebola virus disease (Ebola) tested U.S. hospitals' ability to respond to a serious infectious disease. Very few hospitals received suspected or diagnosed cases of Ebola, but the disease's presence caused hospitals to assess and improve their preparedness for Ebola and other emerging infectious diseases (EIDs).

In November 1994, when the case described above was reported from Côte d'Ivoire, 8 it was the first case of Ebola virus disease (EVD) reported since the case of Tandala in 1979 in the Democratic Republic of Congo. After 15 years of epidemiological silence, Ebola was re-emerging in Africa and for the first time in West Africa.

Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) is a viral disease that first emerged in 1976 in Nzara, Sudan and Yambuku, Zaire (Lever & Whitty, 2016). During the initial outbreak, over 600 people were suspected to be or had been confirmed infectious and the death rate had nearly reached 90% (Lever & Whitty, 2016).

Ebola is considered an emerging infectious disease. It was first recognized in 1976 as the cause of twin outbreaks of disease near the Ebola River in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (then known as Zaire) and in a region of Sudan. Some 300 people in each country became infected.

An emerging infectious disease (EID) is an infectious disease whose incidence has increased in the past 20 years and could increase in the near future. Emerging infections account for at least 12% of all human pathogens. EIDs are caused by newly identified species or strains (e.g. Severe acute respiratory syndrome, HIV/AIDS) that may have evolved from a known infection (e.g. influenza) or ...
