Necessary and Proper Clause. Article 1, Section 8, of the Constitution, which gives Congress the power to make all laws that are necessary and proper for carrying out its duties. Implied Powers. powers the government requires to carry out its expressed constitutional powers.

One of the most significant applications of the commerce clause has been in the area of civil rights. In the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Congress used its powers under the commerce clause to prohibit racial discrimination in restaurants, hotels, and motels.

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
