Describe the mind-set and practice assumptions of brief narrative therapy. Be familiar with the structure and accompanying micro-practices of brief narrative therapy. Demonstrate familiarity with questions that elicit people's local knowledge and preferences for life. Utilize documentation practices and co-create take-away documents.

Narrative Therapy is based in the notion that we make meaning of our lives through the stories we live out as we interact with each other. These stories are shaped and constrained by the stories that are carried in our social, political, and interpersonal contexts--the narratives of myths, movies, novels, TV ads, fairy tales, and family legends.

Narrative therapy in social work can use a metaphor to externalize a problem is to consider and talk about the named problem as a roommate, a problematic person who resides with the client. For a client experiencing depression, client and clinician might choose to name the problem “Depression,” or personify the problem further by calling it “Eeyore” for example.
